PREPARATION & EVACUATION CHECKLIST

Prepare before a hurricane:

- Prepare in advance
- □ Know where evacuation routes are located. Check with drivetexas.org to find routes near you.
- Download the FEMA app at fema.gov/mobile-app to find a shelter near you.
- □ Prepare an evacuation plan
- □ Sign up for your community's emergency warning system
- □ Gather emergency supplies
- Gather financial, medical, educational, and legal documents and records
- Prepare a bug-out bag a portable kit containing items that will help you survive for 72 hours during an evacuation
- Prepare a family communication plan
 - □ Select someone outside of your immediate household to be a point of contact
 - Select a meeting point if case someone cannot get home
- Take pictures/videos of house contents and the exterior of your home
- Inventory house contents
- □ Gather most important numbers
- □ Backup documents to cloud or a thumb drive
- Partially fill plastic one-liter or larger soft drink bottles with water and freeze. If power goes out, the frozen water will help keep the freezer cool and when the ice melts, the water will be drinkable.
- □ Make necessary repairs to ensure the integrity of your home
- □ Ensure you have adequate exterior window coverings
- Review your home insurance policies to make sure you have adequate coverage
- □ Remove dead tree limbs
- Have generator checked

In the event of a hurricane evacuation:

- Follow local emergency instructions
- □ Confirm Family Communication Plan with everyone
- □ Notify Out-of-town family of evacuation plans
- □ Cover windows
- □ Bring in loose, lightweight outdoor items
- □ Anchor outdoor items that cannot be moved inside
- Anchor propane tanks & central air conditioner units
- □ Charge phones & computers
- □ Wear sturdy shoes & clothing no matter what you are planning to do
- □ Talk to neighbors Confirm each other's plans Exchange contact information.
- □ Take items/photos that are irreplaceable or may provide comfort to your family
- Pack "priceless" items to be moved to an interior safe room above floor level
- Unplug appliances (except fridge & freezer) Turn fridge & freezer to lowest setting
- Unplug electrical devices, TVs, appliances, etc...
- Turn off propane tanks
- □ Fill bathtubs with water
