

ORDINANCE # 110 ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMUNITY CENTER, PARKS AND RECREATION COMMITTEE

Establishing a new committee to be known as Community Center, Parks and Recreation committee (CCPR) to replace both the current Park and Community center committees, known as Ordinances number 95 and 102 respectively.

WHEREAS, It is deemed appropriate to promote and encourage the use of the towns parks and community center for health, entertainment and sense of community spirit;

Now Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF BAYSIDE, REFUGIO COUNTY TEXAS, this instrument be known as Ordinance number 111, replacing all previous ordinances pertaining to Parks & Recreation and Community Center committees.

SECTION ONE: Creation of Committee

The town council shall create a Community Center , Parks and Recreation Committee to be known as CCPR, whose primary duties shall be to advise the town council in carrying out its various duties and functions regarding community center and parks, including the area at the community center known as the sports court and outdoor area surrounding the sports court. In addition to also include the proposed kayak launch and bird watching deck.

SECTION TWO: Organization and Qualifications

The CCPR will consist of a minimum of five members and an unlimited maximum. The members of the current Community Center committee and the current Parks committee will automatically become members of the CCPR. The applicants for new membership will be approved by town council. Applicants for membership shall have lived in or owned property in the Town of Bayside for a minimum of six months. The committee shall elect a chairperson and a co-chair from among the membership. The committee shall meet not less than once every 60 days. The committee shall follow Roberts rules of order and shall submit agendas and minutes for each meeting to the city secretary. Membership in said committee can be terminated for cause by the town council, including but not limited to, missing three consecutive meeting without the approval of the chair or actions deemed adversely affecting the public interest.

SECTION THREE: OBJECTIVES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CCPR

Recommendations to the town council on maintenance, repairs, usage, improvements, and additions to both the Parks and Community Center.

Ability to hold public hearings to determine the needs and wishes of the public.

Manage the existing Parks budget to include the sports court area and the kayak launch.

SECTION FOUR: SEVERABILITY, CONFLICT, AND VALIDITY

SECTION 4-1 Severability. If any court of this State or the United States of America shall hold any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or word contained in this ordinance unconstitutional, the invalidity of such portion of the ordinance shall not be construed to affect any other part of this ordinance.

SECTION 4-2 Conflict. All ordinances or parts of ordinances including but not limited to Ordinances 95 and Ordinance 102 in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4-3 Validity. The validity of any section, clause, sentence, or provision of this ordinance shall not affect the validity of any other part of this ordinance that can be given effect without such invalid part or parts.

SECTION FIVE: EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall be effective upon adoption.
