ORDINANCE # 28

AN ORDINANCE TO CHANGE THE OFFICIAL CLASSIFICATION
OF THE TOWN OF BAYSIDE, COUNTY OF REFUGIO, STATE
OF TEXAS, FROM CHAPTER 11 TO CHAPTER 1 THROUGH 10

Article 961, Section 41 of Vernons Civil Statutes states " Any City or Town, regardless of its population, containing one or more manufacturing firms may by popular vote of its Council at a regular meeting adopt Chapters 1 through 10."


WHEREAS, the Town of Bayside having one or more manufacturing firms within its corporate limits, said firm being, Bayside Express Seafood, a seafood packing and distributing company, is in accordance with the provisions of said article and therefore qualified to adopt said Chapters 1 through 10.


THEREFORE, on a motion made by Councilman Irby Johnson, second by Mayor Pro-Tem Larry Green, the Board of Aldermen did by unanimous vote adopt Chapters 1 through 10, on this the 27th day of August, 1985.

THEREFORE, it is declared to be the intentions of the City Council that the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this ordinance are separable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section shall be declared unconstitutional or invalid by the valid judgement or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs or sections of this ordinance.

Method of Changing to This Type of City	TYPE A GENERAL LAW CITY	TYPE B GENERAL LAW CITY	TYPE C GENERAL LAW CITY
	Any city with 600 or more inhabitants, or which has one or more manufacturing establishments or is incorporated under any law of the Republic of Texas may change to Type A on 2/3 vote of governing body recorded in minutes signed by Mayor, attested by City Clerk or Secretary, and filed with County Clerk.	No provision to change to Type B.	Type A with 501 to 4,000 or a Type B with 501 to 999 inhabitants may change to Type C. Petition signed by 10% of voters filed with Mayor. Election is ordered if vote is affirmative, Mayor enters change in minutes.
